The Joy of Counting

How do I get to the next level?

- Recently, a lot of people have been asking me this question.
- Usually, they expect it's about learning some secret as declarer.
- Or maybe learning to be a better defender.
- Or maybe it's learning a cool new convention.

These can help. But, there's something bigger:

COUNTING!

Are you kidding me?

Counting affects 100% of hands

- Declarer play only impacts 25%.
- Defense only impacts 50%.
- A typical convention gets used on less than 10% of hands.

You're already doing some counting.

- You count winners.
- You count losers.
- You count tricks.

This is a good starting point.

This is what most people think of as "counting:"

- distribution by suit for each hand
- high-card points for each hand

WARNING: When you start doing this, your results may suffer.

Factoring in the rest of the information:

- What was bid?
- What wasn't bid?
- What does the lead tell me?
- What does the discard mean?



- The only time we open 1♦ with exactly three♦ is...

- Does NOT have 4+♠ would have supported.
- MUST have 4+♦ opening ♦ bid without 4+♠.
- Has 12 14 points (1NT rebid).
- This means partner has 6 8 points.

- West has four the ♣2 has to be her 4th best.
- So South also has 4 clubs.

- If South had 5+, he would have bid them.
- So they must be 4 4.

- So we should lead a spade to trick 2.

- Can finesse ♣ in either direction.

- When South follows to all three •tricks, you don't need to guess.

How should I go about improving?

Like any bridge skill, it's important to start slowly.

- 1. Start by counting when you're dummy.
- 2. When dummy comes down, do a quick estimate of what you know.
- 3. Walk though BBO movies of old hands, one trick at a time.
- 4. Play free daily games against the robots.
- 5. Count a single suit.
- 6. Move to the whole hand.
